

Construction and building transformation continues this summer

Construction at ThriveOn King continues to transform the building. On the fourth floor, painting has begun and communication wiring has been installed. Infill on the mezzanine and installation of ducts, sprinklers, and drywall, continues to shape the building. Construction of the elevator tower and shaft, which can be seen from outside at the back of the building, has reached up to level five. On the third floor, the Chicago window installations are under way and should be completed soon. A steel vestibule was installed outside, and the parking garage is taking shape.

A robust roster of tenants and features will bring ThriveOn King to life when

completed in early 2024. The historic former Gimbels-Schuster's building on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive will be home to the Greater Milwaukee Foundation's headquarters, offices for the Medical College of Wisconsin's community engagement programs, an exemplar early childhood education center operated by Malaika Early Learning Center, a community hub for Versiti BloodCenter of Wisconsin, new headquarters for JobsWork MKE, community gathering spaces, healthy food options, public art and mixedincome housing for families and seniors.
